

REPORT SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious Activity is any observed behavior that could reasonably indicate terrorism or terrorism-related crime. This includes, but is not limited to:

- **Eliciting Information:** Questioning individuals at a level beyond curiosity about a facility's purpose, operations, security procedures, and/or personnel, etc.
- **Observation/Surveillance:** Paying unusual attention to facilities beyond casual activity that includes unexplained or extended loitering; unusual or prolonged observation of a facility with binoculars or a video camera; using a camera or phone to take pictures; taking notes or sketching floor plans, etc.
- **Testing or Probing Security:** Attempting to gain unauthorized access to a restricted or non-public area, impersonating authorized personnel, or leaving unattended and suspicious packages, procedures, and/or personnel, etc.
- **Sabotage/Tampering/Vandalism:** Damaging, defacing, or destroying a critical part of a facility.

- **Radicalization:** Advocating/sympathizing support for terrorist organizations or their objectives; providing financial or other material support to a terrorist organization or to someone suspected of being a terrorist; repeated browsing or visiting websites that promote or advocate violence directed against the United States or that promote terrorism or terrorist themes; Advocating violence, the threat of violence, or use of force to achieve goals that are political, religious or ideological in nature.

What to report:

- **Who or what you saw**
- **When you saw it: Date and Time**
- **Where it occurred**
- **Why the actions were suspicious**
- **Submit any related images /documents**

Some of these activities could be innocuous and law enforcement will determine whether the behavior warrants investigation. Factors such as race, ethnicity, and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious. The public should only report suspicious behavior and situations (e.g., an unattended package, surveillance, or testing or probing security, etc.).
